MENLO PARK ACADEMY continued to grow both its reputation and enrollment during the 2021-2022 school year. Enrollment grew to 592 students from 51 school districts and nine counties across the state of Ohio.

Menlo Park Academy's efforts also garnered public recognition for its excellence in education. The community school was ranked as the No. 1 Charter Elementary School and No. 1 Charter Middle School by Niche.com as well as among the top 10 of all public K-8 schools in Ohio.






State Testing

(percentage of students)




Menlo Park Academy NWEA MAP Testing

The preferred benchmark assessment used by Menlo Park Academy is the NWEA MAP, or the Measure of Academic Progress. MAP is a computerized adaptive test which helps teachers, parents, and administrators improve learning for all students and make informed decisions to promote a child's academic growth. Menlo Park Academy is proud to share our students' MAP data. Menlo Park Academy's MAP data demonstrates that our 2021-22 academic growth persisted along the same strong growth curve as pre-pandemic growth.

Staff, Parent And Student Satisfaction Survey

Annual Survey Summary

Three stakeholder groups responded to the 2021-2022 Menlo Park Academy Annual Survey: Staff, Parents and Students in grades 5-8. There were 40 Staff respondents, 113 Parent respondents and 136 Student respondents.

Respondents indicated they Strongly Agree, Somewhat Agree, Somewhat Disagree or Strongly Disagree with each item. Respondents could also mark each item as Not Applicable. Similar questions were asked across all three surveys, including the measurement of each group's overall satisfaction related to experience and growth at Menlo Park Academy.

SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

Staff: 100 percent Strongly Agreed or Somewhat Agreed that in communications, "Responding to individual parent questions and concerns is an important aspect of teaching at MPA" 97 percent Strongly Agreed or Somewhat Agreed in educational programming, that they "Challenge and teach at students' appropriate instructional levels."

Parents: 94 percent Strongly Agreed or Somewhat Agreed that in communications, "The Weekly Digest helped me stay informed about upcoming events, important dates, and activities." 79 percent Strongly Agreed or Somewhat Agreed in the overall experience, that "MPA provides an excellent education for its students."

Students (Grades 5-8): 88 percent Strongly Agreed or Somewhat Agreed in their needs as a student, that "My classes included using project-based learning to help me understand the content." 81 percent Strongly Agreed or Somewhat Agreed that in the overall experience, "Overall, I am satisfied with my progress and learning at MPA this year, regardless of modality."



Attendance

The Menlo Park Academy student body continued to attend with a daily student reporting rate of 92.2 percent for the 2021-22 school year.

Re-enrollment

Of our 2020-2021 school year student population, 93 percent returned for the 2021-2022 school year.

Volunteers

Menlo Park Academy would not exist, let alone thrive, without the commitment of our parent community. A productive parent relationship with school faculty strengthens community and allows MPA students to thrive in a way that could not be accomplished otherwise.



Fundraising Activities

Parent volunteers are also an important part of Menlo Park Academy's fundraising efforts. In 2021-2022, the school continued the online fundraising portion of the Winter Benefit, raising over \$25,700. Additionally, the school hosted an annual Walkathon, generously raising over \$21,700. We received continued support from other fundraisers leading to a total of \$65,480.48 raised for the year.

Mock Trial





The Educational Service Center of Lake Erie West (ESCLEW) served as sponsor for Menlo Park Academy during the 2021-2022 school year. ESCLEW monitored the school's academic and fiscal performance, as well as organization and operation of the school, and determined that the school was overall compliant.

Mission:

The ESCLEW Community Schools Center is a student-centered authorizer of charter schools, advancing quality educational opportunities throughout the state of Ohio.

The Educational Service Center of Lake Erie West (ESCLEW) has been sponsoring community (charter) schools in Ohio since 1998 and was one of the original pilot program sponsors. Today, ESCLEW provides responsible oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance to 54 community schools statewide. The staff in our Community Schools Center helps to provide a focus on academic, operational, and fiscal integrity. The Community Schools Center is accepting applications for new schools and replication or transfer of sponsorship for the 2021-22 school year.

Community schools attract students because of the uniqueness of their particular educational approach and program offerings. Community schools prioritize developmentally appropriate instruction, educational effectiveness, and academic achievement. Schools sponsored by the ESC of Lake Erie West include 22 special needs schools, two autism schools, a gifted school, and an e-school. We also sponsor schools that focus on STEM education, college preparatory classes, career and technical education, and character development.

The promise community schools hold for educational reform lies in a thoughtful combination of freedom and accountability. Underwritten with public funds but run independently, community schools are held accountable by their sponsors for academic and fiscal performance and must meet the same rigorous standards as traditional school districts.
